CONFLICT RESOLUTION FOR PARENTS AND KIDS

COLLECTION FOR HAITI RELIEF

MENU FOR THE FUTURE: FOOD AND FAITH

Menu for the Future is a **six-session small community** course that explores the connection between food and sustainability. It explores food systems and their impacts on culture, society and ecological systems; extends insight into agricultural and individual practices that promote personal and ecological well-being; helps participants to consider their role in creating or supporting sustainable food systems.
