MENU FOR THE FUTURE: FOOD AND FAITH

Menu for the Future is a **six-session small community** course that explores the connection between food and sustainability. It explores food systems and their impacts on culture, society and ecological systems; extends insight into agricultural and individual practices that promote personal and ecological well-being; helps participants to consider their role in creating or supporting sustainable food systems. Topics covered are: What's Eating America, Anonymous Food, Farming for the Future, You Are What You Eat, Toward a Just Food System, and Choices for Change.

SOLVING CONFLICTS BETWEEN PARENTS AND TEENS/PRE-TEENS

You are invited to the next Justice Sunday presentation on Sunday, 28 February from 7-9pm at Aloysius Hall, St. Agnes. Our presenter, Eileen Blanton, is Executive Director of the Peace Education Program which trains young people, educators and youth workers to:

de-escalate conflicts, listen and problem solve with respect, and take responsibility for their actions. With twenty eight years in the profession, she teaches nonviolent conflict resolution with humor and skill. She is the co-author of three training manuals.

Parents deserve plenty of attention and respect for the stresses and responsibilities associated with raise young people. We will practice the basics of nonviolent communication and problem solving: Giving and getting attention, communicating with respect and problem solving.

AWAKENING THE DREAMER, CHANGING THE DREAM

Lenten Regulations

Abstinence from meat is observed on Ash Wednesday and all Fridays of Lent by all Catholics 14 years and older.

Fasting is observed on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday by all Catholics who are 18 years of age but not yet 59. Those bound by this rule may take only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted as necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted.

Stations of the Cross will begin in church this Friday & continue each Friday during Lent at 7PM (with the exception of Good Friday); please join us in praying the Passion of Christ.
