As you pass this little church,

God won't ask "Who is it?"

Sometimes when celebrating funerals I would like to quote that poem; I will look at our cantor, Lori, and realize she is the only person responding to the liturgical prayers that we always dialogue. It must frustrate her, too, when no one sings.

Last week, at the weekday liturgy for the primary grades, I stopped them after the Eucharistic Acclamation, and asked Joe Edlin to play the piece again, so that THIS time around we would actually sing. Clearly children learn from adults, and when we fail to participate at Mass, guess who's watching? The Document on Sacred Liturgy from Vatican II (*Sacrosanctum Concilium*) tells us that "...the faithful should be led to that fully conscious and active participation in liturgical celebrations which is demanded by the very nature of the liturgy."

**RESTORATIVE JUSTICE/ RESTORATIVE
DISCIPLINE FOCUS FOR CLOUT**

We are in the final stretch toward CLOUT's Nehemiah Assembly on March 22nd. This year our goal is to pilot a program called "Restorative Justice/ Restorative Discipline" in one middle school and one high school, and to adopt it in the juvenile court system. This process brings together the young offender, their parent/s and those affected by the violence/crime to look at the situation that has brought about such behavior, and to work toward accountability and a just solution. This is the only process used in New Zealand juvenile courts and it has seriously lowered violent crime among youth. It is being used in other cities in the US as well. *The St. Agnes Justice Ministry Network Team strongly urges all parishioners to attend this LOCAL justice-based event. Lenten Regulations

Abstinence from meat is observed on Ash Wednesday and all Fridays of Lent by all Catholics 14 years and older.

Fasting is observed on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday by all Catholics who are 18 years of age but not yet 59. Those bound by this rule may take only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted as necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted.

Stations of the Cross will begin in church this Friday & continue each Friday during Lent at 7PM (with the exception of Good Friday when the Stations are held at 3:00pm); please join us in praying the Passion of Christ.
