You are invited to the next Justice Sunday presentation on Sunday, February 28th from 7-9pm in Aloysius Hall. Our presenter, Eileen Blanton, is Executive Director of the Peace Education Program which trains young people, educators and youth workers to:

de-escalate conflicts, listen and problem solve with respect, and take responsibility for their actions. With twenty eight years in the profession, she teaches nonviolent conflict resolution with humor and skill. She is the co-author of three training manuals.

Parents deserve plenty of attention and respect for the stresses and responsibilities associated with raising young people. We will practice the basics of nonviolent communication and problem solving: Giving and getting attention, communicating with respect and problem solving.

**RESTORATIVE JUSTICE/ RESTORATIVE DISCIPLINE
FOCUS FOR CLOUT**

We are in the final stretch toward CLOUT's Nehemiah Assembly on March 22nd. This year our goal is to pilot a program called "Restorative Justice/ Restorative Discipline" in one middle school and one high school, and to adopt it in the juvenile court system. This process brings together the young offender, their parent/s and those affected by the violence/crime to look at the situation that has brought about such behavior, and to work toward accountability and a just solution. This is the only process used in New Zealand juvenile courts and it has seriously lowered violent crime among youth. It is being used in other cities in the US as well. *The St. Agnes Justice Ministry Network Team strongly urges all parishioners to attend this LOCAL justice-based event. 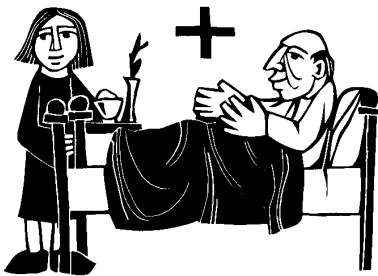

Lenten Regulations

Abstinence from meat is observed on Ash Wednesday and all Fridays of Lent by all Catholics 14 years and older.

Fasting is observed on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday by all Catholics who are 18 years of age but not yet 59. Those bound by this rule may take only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted as necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted.

Stations of the Cross will continue each Friday during Lent at 7PM (with the exception of Good Friday when the Stations are held at 3:00pm); please join us in praying the Passion of Christ.
